INSURANCE Do not declare value or insure in excess of carriers liability.

GENERAL

1. Packing list must accompany each shipment.
2. Whenever practical, consolidate multi-containers in one box. Consolidate all shipments to be forwarded in one day and consign on one collect bill of lading.
3. All material must be described on shipping documents in accordance with the applicable classification or tariff.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Nammo Talley Traffic Department will be contacted for routing instructions prior to the shipment of all 1.1, 1.2, and 1.3 Explosives and large quantities (over 1000 pounds) of 1.4 Explosives. The shipper is to provide the hazard class & division, proper shipping name and UN#, pieces weight, and dimensions or cube of shipment.
2. For shipments of HAZARDOUS MATERIALS, all containers must be properly classified, described, packaged, marked and labeled and in proper condition for transportation according to the applicable requirements of the DOT.
3. Nammo Talley Department will be contacted for routing instructions of all Truckload and Volume Shipments. The shipper is to provide the pieces, weight, and dimensions or cube of shipment. If there is any question as to type of shipment (i.e., LTL or TL) contact the Nammo Talley Traffic Department for clarification.

LOADING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Shipments of 1.1, 1.2, 1.3 and large quantities of 1.4 Explosives will be blocked and braced to prevent movement during transportation.
2. Truckload or volume Shipments will be loaded to facilitate offloading by forklift or pallet jack. Two-way entry pallets must be loaded so that pallet entry openings are facing the tail of the trailer.
3. Truckload or Volume Shipments must be secured within the trailer to minimize shifting and movement during transit. This will be accomplished by blocking and bracing and/or use of cargo rails.
4. If pallets are stacked, ensure that the load is stable and that pallets can be removed by forklift.
